


DB9 (RS-232)




Serial (RS-232) applications: mouse, modem, null modem, monochrome monitors, serial mice, serial printers, other serial devices.

HD15 (aka HDB15)




Video applications: VGA and SVGA monitors, projector. Has 15 pins in the same shell as the 9 pins in the DB-9 connector.

DB25 (aka D-shell 25-pin, or Type A)




Parallel, serial (RS-232) or SCSI: modem, null modem, laplink, printer, scanner and removable storage drive. IEEE 1284.


DIN5 - Older I/O applications: AT Keyboard. Also used as a MIDI cable connection.


Mini DIN6 - (aka PS/2) I/O applications: newer PC keyboards and mice.

Centronics 36 (aka TypeB)




Parallel applications: printer, IEEE-1284 Type B.

Parallel applications: printer & IEEE-1284 Type C. - found on some HP printers.

Centronics 50 (aka CN50, Cent50)



Centronics 50 - External connector on many SCSI-1 and some SCSI-2 Controllers.
